## AMENDMENT ORDINANCE NUMBER: 5-1001

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE TRAFFIC AND THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON THE STRETS OF THE TOWN OF RIDGEWAY, SOUTH CAROLINA; TO REGULATE, RESTRICT AND LIMIT THE USE OF PUBLIC STREETS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF RIDGEWAY; TO DEFINE CERTAIN OFFENSES IN THE USE OF AND OPERATION OF VEHICLES AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council in meeting duly assembled.

WHEREAS, the Council desires to restrict overnight parking on property owned or leased by the Town of Ridgeway;

WHEREAS, in order to restrict parking on property in addition to streets, council strikes Section 8, previously passed prior to 1979, and inserts as follows:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED THAT:

- SECTION 8: PARKING OF VEHICLES No person shall park any vehicle upon the streets of the Town of Ridgeway so that such vehicle constitutes an obstruction to traffic or endangers other vehicles moving on said streets. No person shall park a vehicle except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or by specific direction of a police officer in any of the following places or way.
  - 1. On a sidewalk.
  - 2. In front of or so as to block a private driveway.
  - 3. At an intersection so as to interfere with the vision of drivers of other vehicles or as to interfere with the passage of pedestrians.
  - 4. In front of or within ten feet of a fire hydrant.
  - 5. In any parking place restricted by the Town Council to the use of police vehicles, emergency vehicles, or to the use of physicians.
  - 6. On the left hand side of the street facing oncoming traffic.
  - 7. So as to extend the vehicle over painted lines laid off parking zones.
  - 8. Double parking.
  - 9. No overnight parking on Main Street with the exception of law enforcement and emergency vehicles.

10. No overnight parking on any property owned or leased by the Town of Ridgeway unless for special Town approved events with the exception of temporary parking of law enforcement, emergency, and utility vehicles.
